#### **Facts About Homelessness:**

- Approximately 15% of U.S. citizens (about 47.5 million) live in poverty, with one-third under age 18. (Repair the World's Facilitator Toolbox)
- 13% of Jewish Baltimore relies on public assistance. (The Associated 2020 Community Study)
